A Conference in Memory of Peter Kivy (1934-2017)



Over the course of his 49 year career (48 years of which were spent at Rutgers), Peter established himself as a giant in the field of aesthetics, especially in the philosophy of music. He published 90 articles and 23 books, delivered countless lectures, and wrote numerous reviews.

In addition to being an acclaimed philosopher, Peter was also an accomplished musician. He studied the oboe under the tutelage of the great Ronald "Ronnie" Roseman and played with several groups at venues in New York City and Cape Cod.

Sadly, Peter passed away in May 2017. To honor his memory, we invite friends, colleagues, former students, and admirers to join us at this conference celebrating his life's philosophical work.
